Manager Commentary

Market Overview

The fourth quarter saw strong equity market returns with the MSCI EAFE Small Cap Net Index returning 11.14%. Improving supply chains, rising employment participation rates, and the lagging influence of stabilized home prices and rental inflation continue to promote disinflationary conditions. Declining inflationary pressures, combined with stable economic growth, produced a material improvement in financial conditions as the market discounted future Fed rate cuts without any corresponding decrease in earnings expectations or economic weakness. We expect the European Central Bank, Bank of England, and Bank of Japan will follow the lead from the Fed. The resulting decline in interest rates led to a powerful fourth quarter rally in equity and fixed income markets.

Manufacturing activity in the Eurozone remains bleak. The Eurozone Composite PMI registered 47.0 for December down from 47.6 in November to signal a seventh consecutive monthly reduction in business activity across the Euro region. It is possible that the Eurozone was already in recession during the second half of 2023, though we expect any recession to be shallow and prevent further interest rate increases by the European Central Bank.

Turning to portfolio activities, the quarter saw the addition of ten new companies and nineteen exits.

As we enter 2024, we expect modest economic weakness in the first half of 2024 followed by economic stability and an improvement in growth heading into the second half of the year. Inflationary pressures will likely remain above the Federal Reserve's 2% target and, with the recent dramatic easing in financial conditions, we will be monitoring the inflation situation for any signs of a reacceleration which could dent the trajectory of economic recovery. The direction of the USD is of paramount importance in this context along with the outcome of geopolitical events. We are enthusiastic about the opportunities that the universe and the portfolio offer within a medium to long-term time horizon.

Portfolio Positioning

As a result of buys and sells and market action, the portfolio is overweight Information Technology, Industrials, Communication Services, and Financials and while underweight Real Estate, Materials, Consumer Discretionary, Consumer Staples, Utilities, Energy, and Health Care.

Contributors to Performance

During the quarter, the portfolio experienced positive absolute and negative relative performance. Positive relative performance from Information Technology, Materials, Communication Services, Consumer Staples, and Energy was offset by underperformance in Industrials, Financials, Consumer Discretionary, Health Care, Real Estate, and Utilities.

COMPOSITE DESCRIPTION. Effective 10/1/2019, this composite is comprised of all fee-paying, discretionary International Small Capitalization portfolios in excess of \$1 million under management. Prior to 10/1/19, the composite consisted of all non-restricted, fully discretionary, taxable and tax-exempt accounts which were managed in accordance with the International Small Capitalization Value strategy at Advisory Research, Inc. Effective 10/1/19, the strategy name was changed to International Small Capitalization in order to appropriately reflect the characteristics of the strategy. The International Small Capitalization strategy primarily invests in non-U.S. equities and principally in developed markets with a market capitalization generally within the range of the MSCI EAFE Small Cap Index (Europe, Australasia, Far East). The index is a free-float-adjusted market capitalization index that is designed to measure the equity market performance of developed markets, excluding U.S. and Canada. The index is reported net-of-dividends which indicates dividends are reinvested after the deduction for withholding taxes, using a tax rate applicable to non-resident institutional investors who do not benefit from double taxation treaties.
